Target Population	:	200,000 urban working children of 10-14 years age group of which 60% are girls.
Objectives of the Project	:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ To provide quality non-formal, life-skills-based basic education to 200,000 urban working children and adolescents ages 10 to 14 years of which at least 60% will be girls. ➤ To provide 20,000 (out of 200,000) urban working children and adolescents (13+ age group) with livelihood skills training, and access to support systems to ensure optimally use of life-skills-based basic education to improve their life. ➤ Advocate at City and National levels for education, social and economic policies in favour of working children and their families and for protecting children from hazardous working environment. ➤ Increase awareness of all relevant stakeholders to act in favour of elimination of child labor.

Component-1 : Quality Basic Education	:	➤ 8000 learning centers to be organized in two phases namely Phase-A and Phase-B. In Phase-A 6000 learning

		<p>centers and in Phase-B 2000 learning centers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 25 working children of 10-14 years of ages for each learning center ➤ Learners selected based on the “learner selection criteria” and baseline survey and mapping ➤ 1 teacher for each center and 1 supervisor for 10 centers ➤ Course duration : 40 months in 5 learning cycles; each cycle for 8 months ➤ Learning hours : 2½ hours in a day and six days a week i.e. 2400 hours for 40 months course ➤ Course content: Bangla, Math, Social Studies English and Life Skills. ➤ Learning achievement: Grade-V for Bangla, Social Studies and Life Skills and grade-III for Math, English. ➤ 20 selected NGOs implementing the quality basic education course at six divisional cities.
Component-2 : Livelihood Skills Education	:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Out of 200,000 learners 20,000 selected learners (13+ years) will be provided with livelihood skills training. ➤ 5,000 learners out of 20,000 selected learners will be provided with livelihood skills training by contracting expert organizations/ NGOs ➤ Remaining 15,000 learners will be linked with the different organizations for their livelihood skills training. ➤ Course duration: 3-6 months based on the nature of the course and this will be started after completion of 3rd cycle of the regular course. ➤ Livelihood skills education includes, tailoring, handicraft, leather craft, job searching skills, entrepreneurship, marketing skills, business skills and many other courses.
Component-3 : Advocacy, Social Mobilization and Program Communication	:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Advocacy: Policy dialogue at national and divisional level, media mobilization, TV spots, TV magazine show, light box, sensitization meeting/workshop with public and private organizations/experts ➤ Social Mobilization: Production of TV serial, Radio serial, Radio magazine, erection of billboard, observance of Meena day and International Literacy Day, shikkha mela, production of communication materials. ➤ Program Communication: Focus Group Discussion, Guardians and Employer Motivation, Interactive Popular Theatre, Innovative Communicative Activities
